## Team Tidbits



**Boston, MA** *Stacy-Lauren Cappadona*, team captain for the Boston team, held a bike run on Sunday, July 30th. Stacy-Lauren set up a bike run for bikers, all riding 80 miles ending up at a local VFW hall with a large field where they held a BBQ for the riders. The cost per bike was \$20-at the time of registration, they had already raised \$1660, 83 bikes.



They also raffled off such items as donated products from a Harley Dealership, a Honda dealership gift certificate, Red Sox tickets and NE Patriots tickets. The raffled brought in an additional \$795! 50% of the money raised goes towards Stacy-Lauren's LTN walk, while the other 50% is being presented to the University of Massachusetts Medical Center in Worcester, MA, for new toys in the playroom for all of the kids to share! Stacy-Lauren raised \$1227.50 for her walk from this incredible event!

**Crown Point, In**— *Co-Captains, Lynette Murphy and Beth Fletcher* held a garage sale for 3 days in early July. The two captains received items donated from friends and family members starting in June, they raised over \$1100. Both Lynette and Beth are incredibly touched by the number of people who donated, especially those that were personally affected by cancer. Because of their garage sale, they also met a family with a nine year old boy who battled lymphoma, he is now in remission. This family is now a Friends of Allie affiliate team, Tyler's Tigers. Beth also makes beaded bracelets and sells them for \$6 per bracelet with 100% of the proceeds going to FOA.



**Knoxville, TN**— On August 5th *Ronda Blevins* will be doing a table at her local Wal-Mart to raise funds for Light The Night. This falls in the middle of Tennessee's first ever Tax Free weekend on school supplies, so Wal-Mart should be plenty busy! The Knoxville Team is also planning their Awareness Day at the same location on September 9th.

**Memphis, TN**— Captain, *Kim Johnson* reports that she is "happy to say that the Memphis Team was able to raise over \$200 on our Crop for a Cure, held on July 15<sup>th</sup>", the captain is also still awaiting a final total from their Creative Memories consultant who is donating a portion of her sales. "As I stood in front of the attendees, they took their eyes and attention off the pages they were so diligently working on and focused their attention on me. I was so proud to be up their sharing Allie's legacy, and the legacy of all the children we have grown, to honor and support. I was so proud to share with them that FOA all done and the monies raised, and that we were striving to reach more than \$300,000 this year to put us at the million-dollar mark. In return, they seemed proud to be apart of our mission to reach this goal, by given their donation to take part in the event. We played many exciting games, had lunch and a raffle, and the almost 5 hours passed by before we knew it. I knew it was a success for all when I had multiple people says, 'Please let us know if you have another, we will most certainly attend!' Even if I hadn't raised a dime, the awareness raised at event was priceless. I even have spoke with a lady that might be interested in joining our local team for the walk. " Awesome job, Kim!

On July 4, the team participated in the annual Ewing 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade to raise awareness for the team and the local walk. Lois' brother's antique fire truck was decorated with signs and balloons. They handed out flyers with walk info and the FOA fact sheet on the back to spectators along the route, as well as gave candy to the children. Even their three year old got it in on the act by riding in the fire truck and waving to the crowd. It was a VERY HOT, humid day but they are already talking about doing it again next year. ## PR At Work

From simple email campaigns to co-workers to company-wide fundraisers, our workplaces can be a rich source of help. Getting in the door and finding support in the workplace can increase your Friends of Allie publicity and fundraising for Light The Night. If you are trying to fire up your fundraising efforts at work, here are a few tips to help promote FOA and LTN where you (or your spouse) are employed.

**Approach your human resources department for help.** HR departments may coordinate in-house charity events and could have resources or a community relations program to help promote your LTN fundraising. Also, check for grant or sponsorship opportunities as well as employee-matching funds.

**Approach your boss or a manager who believes in our cause.** Seek out a manager or co-worker who has been personally touched by cancer and ask for their support. Personal stories help people understand the need for support.

**Have a plan.** When you approach your company, tell them what you want to do and what it will entail. Do you want to start a dollar late fee jar for meetings or organize a chili cook-off? Having a proposed plan makes it easier for them to visualize what you need and to say "yes".

**Share the benefits!** Present the FOA Corporate Sponsorship benefits and don't forget you can establish a corporate team as an affiliate (see links to PDFs you can print and share). This is a win-win situation because the company can gain positive publicity in the community through LTN and nationally on the FOA website. Plus, the company-raised monies accrue towards the grant naming opportunity.

**Get senior management involved.** When the executives take the cause to heart, it is easier for others to get involved too. Some creative fundraisers include having the boss answering incoming phone calls for a day or shaving (or dying) the boss' hair if a certain amount is raised.

People naturally want to help a good cause, so don't be afraid to ask! Make connections with people and share the importance of needing a cure. Speak from your heart. Even if you have only one person's attention, you are making a difference!

# Friends of Allie Captain of the Month



## Jill Donahue St. Paul, MN

Elmer L. Andersen Community Service Award recipient, Jill Donahue, shares with us how she discovered Allie Scott and how she continues to be inspired by others in her life who have lost their battles to cancer.

### How did you first discover Allie Scott?

My daughter Katy was born in October of 2003. I was a member of BabyCenter and saw a post about Allie. I went to Jenny's website and my heart was captured.

### What about Allie and her story inspired you to take action in the fight against cancer?

Jenny is a fantastic writer and her ability to share her thoughts and feelings is incredible. I wasn't sure I was going to walk until Allie passed away and I wanted to put my sympathy into action. I decided then and there that I was going to make a difference and joined the local MN Friends of Allie team. My goal was \$100. I raised \$345 within a week and a half of the walk. My husband, daughter and Irish Terrier Molly decided to support me and walked with me that night.

### How do you maintain momentum? What keeps you devoted to Friends of Allie?

My husband and I have always supported any fundraisers that are cancer related. My brother-in-law Alexander passed away from bone cancer in 1997 at the age of 27. It was devastating. In the years after he passed away we had been doing a bike ride for Children's Cancer Research Fund, but they quit doing the ride, so for a few years we didn't do anything except donate money. Then Allie Scott touched our lives. It hit very close to home because of Alex. Also, our daughter Katy was so close in age to Allie. I often thought of the Scott family and wondered if I were in that situation would I be able to find the strength and courage to walk a similar path. My heart went out to them and I hugged my children a little tighter. A high school friend of mine had a nine-year old son who recently lost his battle with cancer. It is people like Allie, Alex and Jared and their families that help me maintain momentum. I think Friends of Allie is a wonderful group of people that are doing some great things. I am proud to be associated with a group of go-getters with big hearts that want to make a difference for children and others whose lives have been affected by something beyond their control. I want to be watching the news in my lifetime and hear that there has been a major breakthrough and that cancer has become something that can be cured as easily as strep throat.

### Recently, Friends of Allie has decided to change it's focus to ALL children fighting pediatric blood cancers, not just Allie, Allie is now our catalyst for changing the lives of many children, what do you think of this change?

I think it is fantastic. Allie's memory is definitely important, but I think it helps us maintain momentum by having a broader focus. The awareness that the Scott family has brought to pediatric blood cancer is amazing and a very solid foundation for Friends of Allie and its mission.

### Please briefly describe your Twin Cities LTN walk in 2005.

If you have never been to Minnesota in September it is beautiful. We walk about 3 miles around the perimeter of Lake Phalen in St. Paul, MN. We did have a few rain drops last year, but nothing soaking. They have great food and lots of things to do. If you are from MN and reading this, please email me and come and join us. It's a lot of fun! (Shameless plug!)

### You currently have 12 registered on your team, how do you go about recruiting?

My friends and family are not given much of a choice. I guess we could call that technique 'strong-arming'! Many of them 'borrow' my technique to recruit their friends and family. I have some very devoted teammates that have been walking since 2004 and they keep coming back! They are the absolute best – I love you guys! I also put in shameless plugs wherever and whenever I can – see above!

### Tell us about you! What are three words you would use to describe yourself?

Outgoing, compassionate and I think I'm pretty smart too! LOL!

### If you had three wishes, what would they be?

The ongoing health and happiness of my family.  
Making the world a better place for any and all people suffering from cancer, homelessness, hunger, abuse, neglect, etc.  
A world that is more contentious of the environment and more ethical.

### What brings you the most amount of joy?

My husband, children and family. I couldn't ask for anything more.

### If you could have lunch with anyone in the world (living or dead) who would it be and why?

I would have to say my brother-in-law Alex. I never had the chance to meet him since he passed away exactly one month before I met my husband. I would like to ask him questions about my husband and talk with him about the kids. I've learned a lot from him already. He came face-to-face with cancer and his own mortality. I can't imagine the strength this takes. I think he left some people with a different outlook on the meaning of life, what it means to have your health and happiness and to look at the big picture. I would love to chat with him about these topics and I have a feeling I would get some really good insights.

### Are you involved in any other charitable or activist causes?

I am very active on our Community Affairs Council at work. Last year we gave away \$188,000 and held numerous fund raisers such as school supply drives, adopting needy families at Christmas, food shelf drives, etc. We just finished raising 8 tons of food for our local food shelves! I was honored and humbled to receive the Elmer L. Andersen Community Service Award last November mainly due to my work with Friends of Allie and LLS. Elmer was the founder of the company I work for and a former governor for the State of Minnesota.

### How long have you been the captain of the Twin Cities LTN team?

I was asked to be co-captain of the team early in 2005 and agreed. Through a twist of fate, I became the proud captain of the MN Friends of Allie team in 2005 and a strong supporter of the Light the Night Walk and the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society.

### What are your plans for this year's LTN walk to make it a success? Any special fundraisers?

I wish I could say that I had some wonderful things planned that would bring in boatloads of cash! Last year my team did a benefit with a live band, food and prizes. It was great, but a lot of work for the \$800 we raised. So my plan is to go with the flow. I plan on continuing my recruiting efforts, selling paper balloons and doing my letter writing campaign. I am also serving on the local planning committee for the St. Paul walk which is taking a little bit more of my time this year.

### What else about you would our readers like to know?

Well, how about some of my thoughts. Our lives here are short and sometimes it is easy to get caught up in the small mundane things in life instead of striving for things that are beyond certainty, I am guilty of this myself. A wise man once shared his favorite Robert Browning quote with me, "Ah, but a man's reach should exceed his grasp, or what's a heaven for?"

The main suggestion being that to achieve anything worthwhile, a person should attempt even those things that may turn out to be impossible. As you strive for the impossible if you understand and keep your priorities in life - for me family, work and community are the top three- I believe you will find your happiness and leave this world a better place. Some may say a cure for cancer in our lifetime is impossible, but I'm willing to reach for it and I hope you are too.

### Jill, if you could also include information about yourself, like, if you are married, have children, if you work, what you do for a living, etc.

My name is Jill Donahue. Brian my wonderful husband and I have been married for 6 years. I have a step-daughter named Lexie who is 8 ½ and daughter named Katy who is 2 ½. Our Irish Freeloader – I mean terrier- Molly is 3. I work in corporate marketing for a group of community newspapers and shoppers. I have an MBA in management from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, MN that I completed just before the birth of Katy. I love camping, gardening and being with my wonderful family and friends.

## *Friends of Allie Pride*

I often reflect back to 2004 and remember the moment when I read a post on my BabyCenter Birth Club board "December 2003 baby needs prayers." That one thread title in that one second, changed my life and changed my focus. That one title woke me up to what was real in life. Children are sick. Children are dying.

After reading one of Jenny's posts, I cried, looked at my 8-month-old son, and tried to put myself in her position. At that moment, I said to myself "I have to do something. I can't just read about this mother and her daughter, cry and feel such despair, and then walk away and let this be a memory. It would be unfair to Jenny, Andrew, Allie or any child stricken with cancer." My next thought was wondering how I was going to explain to my husband that I was going to walk in honor of this little girl who I had never met. Fortunately, he has not only supported me, he has also joined me in my efforts.

I have been so fortunate to have been affected very little by cancer. My grandmother had a mastectomy and my best friend lost her 33 year old sister to breast cancer. Both events hit me hard, but there always seemed to be distance between those two occurrences and myself. It wasn't my mother, my father, my siblings, my nieces or nephews, or God forbid, my children or me. But some day it could be, so I continue to fight by raising every penny I possibly can, so that if one day my life turns upside down because a family member or myself is diagnosed with cancer, I can say that I have done everything I can to prevent this from happening. I have to keep trying, working, raising awareness, and fundraising. This is done so children no longer have to suffer.

Three weeks ago, my co-captain and I hosted a 2-day garage sale with 100% of the proceeds donated to Friends of Allie. We worked hard for this event and we were pleased to have raised just over \$800 in two days. We saw an outpouring of support from neighbors - one donated \$75 and another \$25. Each of these neighbors asked me if I had a family member who was diagnosed with leukemia and if that was why I was doing this. To each I replied, "Thankfully no. I learned about a little girl named Allie from Texas, who was diagnosed with AML. She and her parents taught me and thousands of people worldwide what life is all about and we've been doing what we can to find a cure ever since. We were called into action."

That IS what Friends of Allie is doing. WE are doing what WE can to find a cure. We are aware that our affiliate kids and other children have lost their battles, or are experiencing relapses. We are aware that there are those that have won their battles and we celebrate with those. We are aware that this disease will continue to take children today and tomorrow. But, we are also aware that we are making a difference and we are *making history*.

At the garage sale, a woman and her mother casually asked if we were walking this year. When we said we were, we learned that this woman has a nine year old son who is in remission after a battle with lymphoma. We talked and we laughed and we cried, but in the end, we all agreed that this meeting was meant to happen. They love Friends of Allie and what we stand for. They are so proud of what we've done and they appreciate every penny and every second we spent trying to prevent another child from getting the same diagnosis. Even if we had not raised a single penny at the garage sale, I can tell you that hearing those words from a mother of a nine year old lymphoma survivor made every effort worth it.

I'm so proud to be a part of Friends of Allie. You should be, too.

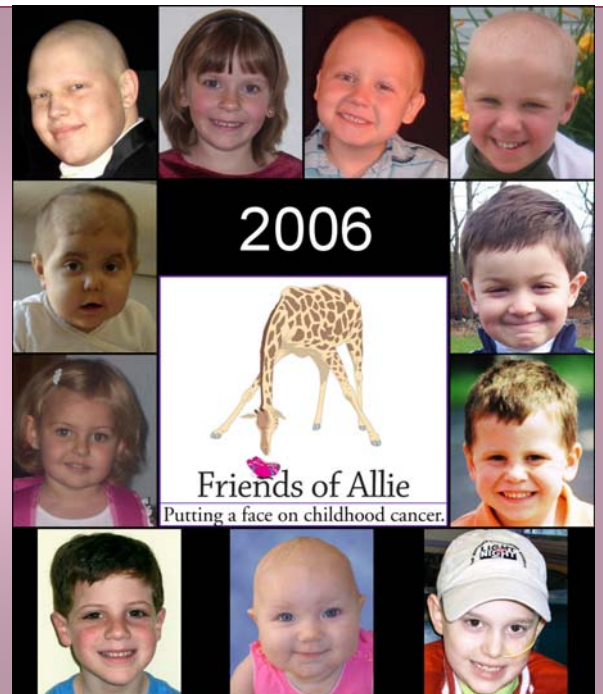
